SIGNIFICANT ACTIVITIES AND CONTRIBUTIONS MADE BY IQAC

Our college established its Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) on 26/05/2004 and since then it has been functioning for the betterment of the institute. It is aimed at promoting an ambience of creativity, innovation and improving quality education. All the members of the committee meet regularly and the proceedings of the meetings are recorded. The cell coordinates the activities of the college, monitors the functioning of the various programs and proposes innovative practices. It meets at the beginning and at the end of the academic year and discusses the issues related to quality improvement of the college from time to time. This cell also examines and addresses the suggestions received through different modes such as verbal, mails, suggestion box and allied channels. Some of the major activities include:

- Planning for the academic year at the beginning of the session
- Dissemination of information on the various quality parameters (sharing latest information regarding new methodologies, techniques, policies with students, staff, etc.).
- Development and application of quality benchmarks/parameters for the various academic and administrative activities of the College.

- Facilitating the creation of a learner-centric environment conducive for quality education and faculty maturation to adopt the required knowledge and technology for participatory teaching and learning process.
- Organization of inter and intra institutional extension lectures, workshops, seminars on quality related themes and promotion of quality circles.
- Documentation of the various programs/activities of the College, leading to quality Improvement.
- Organizing meetings with various stakeholders to maintain internal quality check of the college.
- Getting feedback from various stakeholders and working upon their suggestions after analyzing the feedback.
- Organizing talks on legal education, consumer rights, time management, personality development, soft skills for students and staff.
- > Training students for resume writing and facing the interviews.
- Encouraging students to prepare teaching aids with new technology. Working with LCD, transparency etc. is promoted. Educational Technology room and language Lab is made available to the students.
- > Internal resources (PTA fund) are generated.
- > Improvement in library services is kept in mind.
- Proper feedback mechanism is working in the college. Advice and suggestions given by the students, teachers, experts, the Alumni and other stakeholders are considered for bringing improvement in the college on quality-related institutional processes.
- Computerization of administration, in the process of admissions and examination results, issuance of certificates.
- Facility of First Aid is available in the college and the girls' hostel through the college dispensary.
- Encouraging students to participate in various Academic, cultural and sports competitions.
- Effective teaching practice and increasing teaching practice days to 16 weeks as per NCTE/UNIV norms.
- Improving placement records, supervision of M.Ed dissertation, and participation of faculty members in conferences/seminars.

- Ensuring maximum participation of the students in various curricular and cocurricular activities in the institute, active participation of the students in activities of Health club, Science Club, Human Rights club, Literary Awareness Club, Welfare of Girl Child Club and Environment club, planting trees in the college campus and hostels for clean and green environment. Facility of rain water harvesting is made available to maintain the water level.
- > Organizing educational trip to create awareness about global education.
- Extension lectures by eminent personalities for promoting awareness and social sensitivity among students.
- Organizing blood donation camp, one day camps and seven days NSS camp for inculcating zeal for social work among students.

Criterion – V 5. Student Support and Progression

5.1 Contribution of IQAC in enhancing awareness about Student Support Services

- IQAC assures the formation of administrative committees to perform various administrative duties according to guidelines given in the prospectus.
- Our Institution has mentoring arrangements. In each session, students are divided into sections and tutorial groups. Teachers-in-charge of the tutorial groups act as mentors. Teachers-in-charge provide proper guidance to B.Ed. and M.Ed. students in different areas and encourage them to participate in various curricular and co-curricular activities. They also help these students in solving their personal and academic problems throughout the year. Tutors inform the students about latest academic books and of competitions.
- Model demonstration lesson (both micro- as well as macro) are delivered to student-teachers to acquaint & train them with various skills of teaching. Simulation teaching, Micro teaching, discussion lessons help in inculcating various teaching skills among the students. Various functional labs are operative in the college to give practical inputs to the students. Language lab is used to develop communication skills in the students.
- Developing skills for information processing, life-long learning through library consultation and inculcating reading habits, an internal check on library facilities has been kept through forming a library committee. It is made sure that the book bank facility is available to economically weaker students to have books throughout the year.
- The institute does better where there is easy access to staff and Principal as it enhances the student's growth and development.
- The check is kept that the financial aid is disbursed on time to the needy students from government schemes, alumni fund and scholarships. The teachers and the administrative staff helps the students belonging to SC category whose annual income is less than Rs. 250000 are entitled for full fee concession.
- The college and the IQAC team often invite eminent scholars and writers as guest speakers for inspiring and motivating students.
- Many clubs and societies like Environment club, Health and Fitness club, Legal literacy club, Red ribbon club, Literary society etc. have been functional for over all development and to prepare the students to become good and efficient teachers.

- > Athletic meet, cross country, yoga and meditation hours are the special attractions
- Formation of Student Welfare Council comprising of teacher-in-charge and student body to keep a check on the students' welfare at large.
- The college has well established Guidance and Placement Cell to guide the students as and when required.
- > IQAC keeps a check on the record kept by the in-charge of teaching practice .Record of lesson planning, teaching and supervision is maintained. IQAC ensures the democratic functioning in the

college. CRs are selected section wise. Institute is always ready to provide student support for the growth of the student teachers and to make them professionally capable to undertake teaching as a profession.

- The college has well established Guidance and counselling Cell to guide the students as and when required.
- All students cannot have the same capability and ability in all respects so the guidance and counselling cell is given the duty to find the Advanced and the slow learners without their knowledge that they are being observed.

a) Advanced Learners

- Encouraged to take part in co-curricular activities, often as team leaders.
- Guided for the use of ICT and for preparing power point presentations.
- Motivated to prepare topics and present it in the seminar.
- Provided with the internet facility.

b) Slow Learners

- Remedial Teaching is provided during holidays.
- Teachers recommend books and topics for preparation and teach in mother tongue, if required to the students.
- Mentor teachers motivate them to join advance learners in their projects and to work together
- > The college has constituted a Grievance Redressal Cell.
- Suggestion Box is kept in the college which is checked frequently by the Grievance Cell comprising Principal, Council and hostel wardens. Students are open to share their grievances and extend their suggestions about faculty and institution.
- Keeping in view the priorities, academic calendar in every session is prepared by the college council and IQAC

5.2 Efforts made by the institution for tracking the progression



Our College provides various facilities to the students for preparation for their higher studies and competitive examination.


- Guidance & counselling as well as Placement Cells are functional in the college.

- A virtual classroom is established
- For security purpose and surveillance CCTV cameras have been installed in the institute as well as in the girls and boys hostels.
- Air conditioning of Computer Rooms, ET-Lab/ Seminar Room, Language Lab, Upper Lecture Theatre and Auditorium has been done.

- 63KVA gen set with muffler (Silent) has been installed in the institute. Gen sets of KVA each are also been installed in the girls and boys hostels.
- To provide clean drinking water to students RO filter systems are installed with water coolers in college campus, girls' hostel and boys' hostel.

Feedback Analysis

F-I Feedback from Students

This year the feedback from students about the teachers showed the upward trend. They were judged on the basis of various parameters. It was a random sampling. The students have marked the teachers on 5-point scale. The parameters showed that the students felt that maximum of the teachers were punctual. Their subject skills and overall efficiency scaled from good to excellent. The students appreciated the use of ICT and Smart Boards by the teachers. They appreciated their communication skills. Their testing skill and immediate feedback was also well-appreciated by the students.

The teachers who had good marking were asked to improve from good to excellent at the earliest.

F – II

The feedback form from students about the institute was judged on the basis of 15 parameters on a 5point scale. It was found that lab facilities were marked good by almost all the student sample whereas internet facility was judged excellent and as all the events are celebrated in the college so they gave 4points on the scale of 5. Rest of the 12 parameters were scaled from good to excellent by maximum students. Hostellers remarked that the mess and other facilities provided to them were good.
